Greeley Dairy Youth Extravaganza



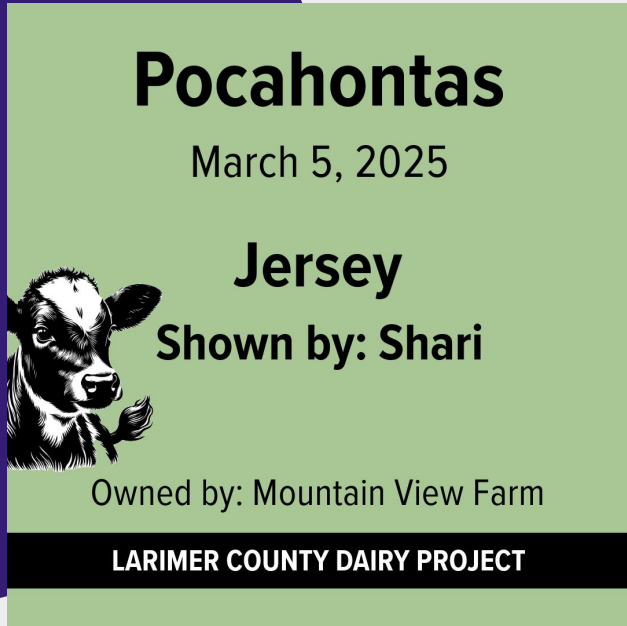
Friday May 30 - Sunday, June 1st at Island Grove Park

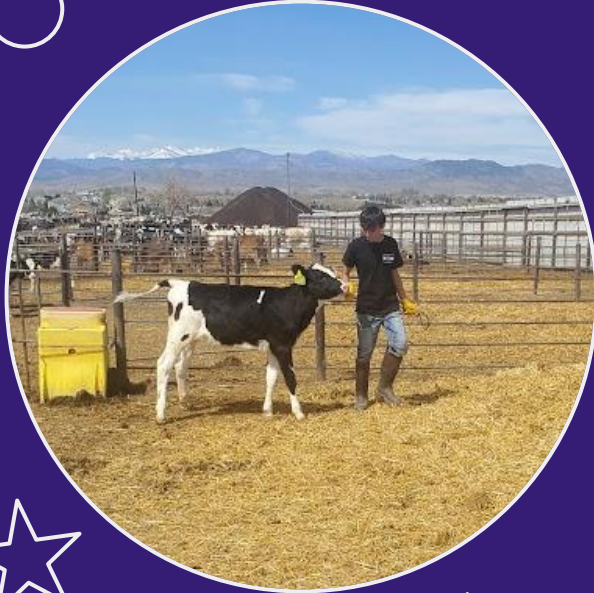

5 Great Showmanship Tips

1. **If you are able, watch a class or two before yours to see what the judge is looking for and what style showman he or she prefers.**
2. Keep your eyes on the judge and always be aware of where he or she is. Good eye contact is a sign of confidence and respect.
3. **The judge may touch your calf, so you may need to reset her. Do so only when the judge has moved on to the next calf in line.**
4. Judges often ask questions about your calves faults, strengths, feeding regimen and breeding, so be prepared. A common question judges like to ask is, "What would you change about your calf if you could?"
5. **Don't stop showing until the judge's decision is final.**
